She won her first match-up by fall in under two minutes. Then, in her semi-final match-up she was behind in the first half by 2, but came around to outscore her opponent in the second half to win 8-4. In her championship duel, she clinched the national title after a tough battle in her home gym at Adrian College. Zoe graduated this year with a degree in Exercise Science/Pre-Athletic Training with plans to pursue a career in strength and conditioning.

Derek Plitt, an Adrian College AT senior, is now a two-time Indoor Track National Runner-Up. At this year's 2022 Division III NCAA National Championships, Derek gathered two All-American accolades, one in the 60m dash and the other in the 200m dash. 
Paying it Forward

Darryl Conway, Alyse (Exelby) Sperry ('12), and Jenna Moreno ('21). Great job everyone and thanks for paying it forward!







Matt Scherer is TikTok Famous!
