Adding Pre-K




Dual Enrollment

Adrian College has the ability to allow high school students the chance to earn college credit and take coursework that will count towards an education degree should they decide to come to Adrian College. Thanks to this wonderful opportunity, it allows students to get a feel for what college classes are like and what it's like to be on campus. For future TED students, this can be a big help as well. Future TED students can get credit up to 9 hours (taking 3 courses potentially) and earn a certificate called "Future Educators Exploration" which can help out in the future and look great on resumes.
