
STUDENT SPOTLIGHT



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Governor Whitmer Launches Website to Help Students Apply for the Michigan Achievement Scholarship, Save Thousands

Governor Gretchen Whitmer launched a new webpage to help the graduating class of 2023 apply for the Michigan Achievement Scholarship and lower their cost of college by thousands of dollars a year. Students should fill out their Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible to save up to \$8,250 over three years as they earn their associate degree at a community college, up to \$20,000 over five years at a private college, or up to \$27,500 over five years at a public university.
