Meet Dr. Kyle Griffith. Dr. Griffith grew up in the city of Adrian and was the first in his family to attend college. He started his post-secondary education at Sienna Heights obtaining a Bachelor of Arts focusing on Social Studies & English, then a Masters of Arts for Secondary Education. He also has obtained a Maters of Science in Intercollegiate Athletic Administration from Cal U of PA, and a Ed.D. in Educational Leadership at North Central University! He has been a teacher, principal, assistant superintendent and superintendent in Lenawee County for 32 years. He is a father of 24 year old triplets and a 19 year old. He and his wife have been married for 30 years now. Dr. Griffith received the honor of Alumni of the Year in 2017 at Sienna Heights University. He has also worked with the mayor of Adrian, Italian government officials and Italian artists to locate over 100 Italians that perished in the 1901 Wreck of the Wabash. They had been placed in unmarked graves and had not had a formal service for their families. After 115 years Adrian and Italy came together to honor those lost. 
STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

NEW READING SPECIALIST ENDORSEMENT

OFFERED

This a fully online program that prepares candidates who already hold teaching certificates in Michigan, to earn an additional K-12 endorsement. This endorsement provides teachers with specialized literacy knowledge and skills that go beyond that of initial teacher preparation. Candidates will take coursework to strengthen their understanding of literacy content and curriculum; instruction and assessment; and how to organize and implement school and district reading programs and essential leadership, coaching, and core teaching practices. Students must successfully complete all coursework and take and pass the MTTC (092) Reading Specialist Test in order to be eligible to add this endorsement to their MI teaching license.

BIG LAUREL LEARNING CENTER

Adrian College's Teacher Education Program once again went to Big Laurel Learning Center. This past summer, Dr. Dawn Milner, Professor, Director of Institute for Education, and six students traveled to the center. This experience not only allows the students to earn clinical hours, but provides outreach, environmental education, and summer enrichment through games, guidance, and hands-on activities for young people in Appalachia in grades 2-6.
